Deontological views form a core group of ethical theories, yet there is considerable disagreement on what the concerns, issues and concepts that distinguish deontological thinking are, on how a deontological ethical theory should be conceived of, and on how deontology compares with alternative views. Hosted by the Institute of Philosophy of Humboldt University, the summer school will address these issues with the general aim of assessing the prospects of deontological views in ethics. It will comprise the discus-

sion of talks and papers and provide plenty of opportunity for philosophical exchange.
